Gaps in the Dermatologic Care for Diverse Populations in the United States (US):

- Increasing proportions of people with skin of color in the US underscore the need to understand and address existing dermatology care gaps.
- The dermatological medical community seeks to shift towards a more patient-centered model of care that considers the distinct needs of racial and ethnic groups across the US.
- A coordinated approach may be needed to create impactful change and address the dermatological care gaps of patients with skin of color.

Studies were conducted to evaluate the existing care gaps and propose SOC-related dermatology initiatives to address the identified care gaps.

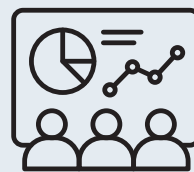
