WHEN IS A PATIENT WITH ATOPIC DERMATITIS ELIGIBLE FOR SYSTEMIC TREATMENT?

Most patients with persistent moderate-to-severe atopic dermatitis have poorly controlled disease and will require an advanced systemic therapy at some point.^{1,2} Who is eligible to an advanced systemic treatment in atopic dermatitis? Case 1

Age, gender, profession

Prescription

- Failed multiple topical corticosteroid treatments
- Recently tried triamcinolone 0.1%, which did not work
- Intolerant to multiple non-steroidal topicals

History of current illness

- Hands (<10% BSA)
- Severe itch impacting his day-to-day life

- Clobetasol 0.05% cream hands BID prn

History of current illness

- Hands (<10% BSA)
- Has adapted her life to her condition (limited social activities, tries to work remotely when possible)



BSA = Body Surface Area. BID = two times a day.
